From the Desk of the Principal, Tim Krupicka

How quickly things move along when school resumes in August. We went from welcoming teachers and students back to being at mid-term of the first quarter and halfway through the fall sports seasons. Things are off to a great start at Northwest. As I am starting my first year here as principal, I have been so impressed with the ability of our students to deal with schoolwork, activities, family commitments and jobs. It is an extremely busy existence being a high school student and I appreciate the family support our students have for making it work.

Parent-Teacher Conferences – The time is quickly approaching for parents and Northwest teachers to participate in the first of our two parent-teacher conferences. Please make plans to attend the conferences scheduled for 3:30-8:00 pm, Wednesday and Thursday, October 20 and 21. Even though many parents maintain a steady interest in their student's progress through our Powerschool program, parent-teacher conferences offer an opportunity to have a brief discussion of student progress in a face-to-face setting. Due to the limited amount of time and the number of our students that each teacher teaches, please try to limit your conference with each teacher to 5 minutes. If you feel that more time is needed, please make arrangements with the teacher to meet during the teacher's planning period or at another arranged time. Some of the topics that you may want to address with the teacher may include:

- What is my child doing well? What does my child need to work on?
- Is my child attentive in class?
- Is my child working up to their potential in class? And what could be done to help improve their work?
- Is homework being completed on time and accurately?
- Does my child participate in class discussions and volunteer information on a regular basis?
- Does my child act in a respectful manner to the teacher and other students?
- Does my child seem to be adapting to the social setting of school?

Meet with the Principal Meeting – In order to better communicate with the parents of Northwest students, I will be holding a monthly meeting with any parents that will be willing to discuss questions that arise, offer advice, or just chat. These meetings will be held on the first Wednesday of the month. The first meeting will be scheduled for Wednesday, October 6th. The meeting will be from 10:00-11:00 am

Junior & Senior Class Parent Meetings – Junior and senior class parents are reminded that the post graduation and post prom meetings will take place during parent teacher conferences. The senior Post Graduation parent meeting will be Wednesday at 7:00 pm, October 20 in the Media Center. The junior Post Prom parent meeting will be Thursday at 7:00 pm, October 21 in the Media Center. All parents of junior and senior students are encouraged to attend the scheduled meetings.

Northwest Offering John Baylor Test Prep

Northwest will again be offering the John Baylor Test Prep class to help students prepare for the ACT. A new feature this year will allow students to have access to the Baylor Test Prep online program from home. Students will be able to view the short video presentations and practice the skills needed to boost their scores, any time of the day or night. In order to access the program, students need to give their email address to Mrs. Jane Brown so a password can be created.

John Baylor will be at Northwest on October 14th to do a refresher course for the seniors that took the class last spring. Seniors should sign up with Mrs. Brown by October 11th if they wish to take the course, in preparation for the October or December ACT. In addition to these opportunities, Mr. Baylor will be at Northwest in the spring to teach a class for juniors preparing for the April or June ACT. All juniors should take the ACT in December or February, prior to taking the class in the spring.

NOTES FROM THE COUNSELING OFFICE

Thank you to Mrs. Lori Merritt for her hard work in developing our website. Log on to the Northwest Website and click on the Counselors' Corner link. Check it out to get upcoming events, scholarship information plus much more. The website will be updated as new information is received.

Thanks to the **Senior** parents who attended the Senior Parent Scholarship Night. We hope the information provided to you was helpful. Ms. Kieselhorst met with all seniors, either one-on-one or in a group/class setting and gave each senior information on colleges, careers and scholarship information. Transcripts were given to each senior. The Horatio Algers and Coca Cola scholarships were given to all seniors so they can begin to complete scholarship applications. Ms Kieselhorst had each senior complete a senior survey. She will again be meeting with all seniors and give them the first scholarship list. The scholarship list will also be posted on the Northwest website under Counselor's Corner. College visits can be set up either by you or the counseling office. If you want the counseling office to set the visit up for you a form can be picked up in the counseling office. UNO would prefer students wanting to visit their campus to go the UNO website BEaAV.com and schedule their own visit.

PSAT – Juniors will have the opportunity to take the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship (PSAT/NMSQT) on October 13th. The test measures reading, math, and writing skills needed for college and is the first step in entering the National Merit Scholarship Corporation competitions for scholarships and recognition. It also serves for a pre SAT measuring device and is used by different businesses in their scholarship selection. Check with your place of employment to see if your son/daughter needs to take this test. Students wanting to take the test can register in the counseling office by bringing in a \$13.00 check by October 8th.

ASVAB – Juniors had the opportunity to take the ASVAB on September 10th. Mrs. Merritt went over the results of the test on September 16th. On Friday, September 17th, Mrs. Merritt and Ms. Kieselhorst met with all juniors to update their four year plan, go over graduation requirements using student's transcripts and discuss community service hours.

PLAN – Sophomores took the PLAN, which is a pre ACT test on September 28th. The ACT is very popular with our juniors and seniors and this is a means to measure the ACT as a sophomore. The counselors will be going into the classroom to go over the results later in the semester and the results of the test will then be sent to parents. The counselors also will go over graduation requirements using student's transcripts and community service hours will be discussed.

EXPLORE – Freshmen took the EXPLORE test on August 27th. The test is a great measuring tool for students and teachers. These results will be used by the teachers in reinforce classroom instruction. The results of the test will be shared with students and mailed out to parents later in the semester.

FRESHMEN NOTES - Mrs. Merritt and Ms. Kieselhorst met with all the **Freshmen** during the 2nd week of school to help the students complete the "COPS" career inventory. We will use this information to assist students in developing a 4-year plan and career goals. A copy of the 4-year plan will be mailed home. We encourage you to sit down with your son/daughter and discuss this plan with them as you help them prepare for their future.

PowerSchool

As a parent, I'm sure you want to keep up with what is happening at school.

With the help of PowerSchool you can keep track of your child's grades and

attendance. You can also view the school's daily bulletin. To do this all you need is the school's web site and your guardian password that was mailed to you earlier this quarter. Open your web browser to www.ginorthwest.org.

PowerSchool has changed and everyone needs to go to "create account" on the PowerSchool page and make a new username and password for your family—to do this:

Click on the create account button and then enter your first and last name, your email address, a username and password (these need to be at least 6 characters and no symbols). Go to the bottom of the page and add your son/daughter's name and then your Guardian ID and password and then how you are related to them--Click submit.

Now you should be able to use your new username and password to log in to PowerSchool. This will take you to the page that shows your student's grades and attendance. Click on a specific grade to see all the assignments that have been recorded. Click the back button to go to the main screen and check the grades for other classes. When you click on the teacher's name it will take you to your email program. You can then send the teacher an email with your questions or concerns.

At the top of the PowerSchool page are several icons. If you click on the **Email Notification** icon it will bring you to a page that will let you receive a weekly email showing your student's grades. I would recommend that you select only the first check box (Summary of current grades and attendance) and choose "Once a week" for "How often?" Checking the "Send now" box will send the email immediately and then every Monday morning after that. Under "Email address(es)", you may type as many addresses as you wish separated by a comma. The **School's Daily Bulletin** can also be found at the top of the PowerSchool page. Click the icon and it will bring up the current bulletin. These “mini college fairs” feature representatives from state and regional colleges along with college planning and financial aid information.

The importance of getting involved!

Start the school year by getting involved in extracurricular activities to increase your chances for scholarships and admission to your top colleges. Use the [Activities Resume](#) at [EducationQuest.org](#) to track your involvement throughout high school – then the information is readily available when it's time to apply.

Senior students and parents...start preparing for college admission!

College may still seem far off, but admission deadlines will start hitting later this fall. Follow these steps to stay on track:

1. Contact your top colleges NOW and ask about application deadlines for admission, college-based scholarships and financial aid. Ask if you need a separate application for scholarships, and about application fees.

2. Visit with college representatives at College Fairs, Educational Planning Programs, during campus visits, and when they visit your high school.

3. Apply to your top 3-4 colleges before the deadline. Along with your application, the colleges will require your high school transcript, class rank, GPA and ACT/SAT score. They may also request a list of your extracurricular activities, letters of recommendation, an essay and an interview.
