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

# **District 82** A Message from the Superintendent

Northwest Community,

On behalf of everyone here at Northwest Public Schools, I would like to thank you for helping us navigate through the past 18 months of COVID. We have been faced with situations and challenges never seen before in education. Through the hard work and dedication of the Northwest staff, students and Northwest community, our students have continued to prosper both in the classroom and through activities.

About a year ago at this time, a joint committee made up of members from the Board of Education, Foundation Board, Athletic Boosters and Fine Arts Boosters met to discuss projects across the Northwest facilities. The Rosencrants Gym at the high school has received a makeover with new bleachers, a new coat of paint and redesigned floor. The high school auditorium was also renovated which included seating upgrades, new carpet, paint, lights, and a new curtain with a generous donation from JBS, Inc. and the Stueven Family Foundation.

The joint committee developed a project called "Charting our Future," a project focused on the outside facilities at Northwest High School. The project includes the installation of field turf on the athletic field, a new grandstand and press box, new LED field lights, updated scoreboard, installation of a ticket booth and the addition of a fieldhouse. Funding for the project is being raised through a capital campaign via the Northwest Foundation (501c3); donations are tax deductible. 

This newsletter contains the 2020-2021 Annual Report information for Northwest Public Schools. During the 2020-2021 school year, students in the Northwest school district attended classes at five sites. Lockwood houses our preschool. Cedar Hollow, 1-R, and St. Libory educate Northwest students in grades K-8. Northwest High School serves our students in grades 9 - 12. The schools in the Northwest district provide opportunities for students to attend school in small elementary settings through the 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Northwest High School provides a comprehensive secondary education in a safe environment of about 705 students.
